**RESOLUTION: BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF DICKINSON, BROOME COUNTY, NEW YORK, ADOPTED APRIL 6, 2026, AUTHORIZING FINANCING FOR THE PURCHASE OF A NEW HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT TRUCK AND SALT BOX, AT THE MAXIMUM ESTIMATED COST OF ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000); APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT FOR SUCH PURPOSE; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$150,000 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID TOWN TO PAY THE COST THEREOF**

### PUBLIC WORKS

- Yard waste pickup has begun
- Very little damage was done from the most recent storm
- Commissioner Kie explained that there is a drainage issue on West Lincoln that he would like to get rectified at some point in the next few years. Easements will be needed and proper drainage. It affects 2 houses right now and could affect more if it's not taken care of.
- Gutters that were damaged at the garage from the ice storm, the insurance company is going to pay less deductible. To prevent it from happening again looking into adding heat to the gutters. Next week's meeting he will have the amounts to go over. It is estimated to cost around \$47,000 to replace it and that's without insurance. Would bid it out to have the work done. It will be discussed at the next meeting.

### CODE

- On March 16<sup>th</sup> Officer Doyle met with the VOA and had a good meeting. Met with the CEO and they are going to put fire drills in place twice a year and also a fire safety class once a year. They will provide the fire department with a list of active residents and rooms that are vacant. They have scheduled the training for the middle of April.
- There was runoff from the new solar site. He took pictures and contacted them that morning and they are fixing the issues.
